









- Imparting instruction through lectures, seminars and tutorials.

About Moot Court

A moot court simulates a court hearing (usually an appeal against a final decision), in which participants analyse a problem, research the relevant law, prepare written submissions, and present oral argument. Moot problems are typically set in areas of law that are unsettled or that have been subject to recent developments. They usually involve two grounds of appeal, argued by each side.

The procedure imitates that followed in real courts: the judge enters, the mooters and the judge bow to each other, the clerk announces the matter, the mooters give their appearances and are then called on, in turn, to present their submissions; the judge asks questions to the mooters, the court adjourns, and the judge then returns to deliver a brief judgment and some feedback.

In Som Law College, we organize moot court every year where students who are interested, participate in the event where they are provided with a problem (Moot Problem), students do a legal research with respect to that problem and prepare a memorial on the basis of that research and on the basis of that memorial they argue before the Moot Court, and this is how we train the students for their law career.

Eligibility

Required Academic Qualification-Those candidates who have passed their or H.S.C. (12th class) examination from a recognized board in any stream or Intermediate are eligible for this course.

Minimum Marks- Having 50% marks in H.S.C. (12th class) examination or Intermediate are eligible. The general and OBC category students should have 45% marks in 12th. For the SC/ST candidates to appear in the law after +2 entrance exams, the minimum marks required are 40%.

Age Limit- Twenty (20) years of age for the candidates belonging to unreserved categories. Twenty-Two (22) years of age as for candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC/Specially-abled Persons/Persons with disabilities (SAP/PWD) categories.
